Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to all our visitors who came to our Stone Age Museum last week. The children really enjoyed showing you around and sharing their work with you. We try to make the themes and outcomes purposeful in our curriculum, and creating a museum is a great way to do this.

Well done to all our parents for getting costumes together for World Book Day. The children all looked amazing and really enjoyed dressing up as a character for the day.

Last week we launched our month of reading activities – today is the start of challenge 1. The children have got to find someone to read to them every day for a week. It can be different people, which can help to provide a range of role models for the children. There is a form in the pack of information sent out last week for children to record their readers and use to enter a prize draw. If you don't have a copy, you can get one from the website on the letters for parents' page or let your child's class teacher know.

In last week's assembly, we started to revisit our school values. These are attributes that remind children about how to think of themselves and others. These are not just values for school, but values for life.

In today's assembly, we have looked at Being Kind. Children were asked to imagine a school where everyone was unkind and how sad it would make everyone. Together we thought about the types of behaviours we would see and the words we might hear. We then shared ideas about how the children in the story could stop being unkind and what they could do instead. The children were taught the phrase, *Stop, Think, Be Kind.*

They were also told about the 'Crabs in a Bucket' metaphor. Throughout the assembly they were asked to watch the bucket and let me know if a crab was escaping. At the end of the assembly, I explained why none of the crabs could escape.

Crab mentality, sometimes referred to as crabs in the bucket (also barrel, basket or pot), is a way of thinking best described by the phrase, "If I can't have it, neither can you." The metaphor refers to a bucket of <u>crabs</u>. Individually, the crabs could easily escape from the bucket, but instead they grab at each other in a useless "king of the hill" competition which prevents any from escaping and ensures their collective demise. The analogy in human behaviour is claimed to be that members of a group will attempt to negate or diminish the importance of any member who achieves success beyond the others, out of <u>envy</u>, <u>spite</u>, <u>conspiracy</u>, or <u>competitive</u> feelings, to halt their progress.
