# **Month of Reading Update**

# **Moorside Infant School Update**

On Thursday, 9th March 2017, the school had a Local Authority Review. Feedback from the LA advisers and Emma Higgens from the North Star Teaching Alliance was really positive. The school was able to demonstrate the progress needed to bring the school out of Special Measures.

Our Nursery was praised and judged to be good. In other areas - Leadership, including Governance, Teaching and Learning, and Safety and Wellbeing, they recognised the systems now in place and agreed that the school needed time to embed these.

Leaders were reassured by the feedback, which acknowledged the disruption that staff turnover has had on the progress. It was agreed that the school was in a good position to continue to improve and be capable of doing so without further intensive support.

On behalf of the Governors and School Leaders, I would like to acknowledge and thank the staff and parents of Moorside Infant School, for their support and hard work in taking Moorside Infant School back to being the great school it is – day in and day out.
